Parents Survey

Thank you to everyone who has completed our survey.

We received 41 responses: 17 from Year R, 10 from Year 1 and 12 from Year 2. 2 people didn't specify a year group.

Question 1: Do you feel the teacher and year team are approachable and friendly?	80% strongly agreed 20% agreed We received lots of lovely comments about the year group teams. Thank you for your kind words.
Question 2: Do you feel any concerns are taken seriously/acted upon by the class teacher?	76% strongly agreed 22% agreed 1 person was neutral
Question 3: Do you feel your child's class teacher is accessible for discussing your child's progress?	80% strongly agreed 20% agreed
Question 4: Do you feel the office team are approachable and friendly?	88% strongly agreed 10% agreed 1 person was neutral We received lots of lovely comments about office team. Thank you for your kind words and for recognising their hard work.
Question 5: How satisfied are you with the frequency and clarity of communication?	55% strongly agreed 30% agreed 15% (3 people) were neutral
	Communication is always a tricky to find the right balance for everyone. Some people would like more communication, others would like less so straight away you can see our quandary! Comments received were really positive about the weekly overview sent every Friday. To further improve, we have been setting key dates for next year and will share these with you in September as a regular part of the weekly overview. We appreciate that sometimes things do change at short notice, particularly at this time of year but we do try to limit these changes where possible. All key information will continue to be sent to you via email. Tapestry is to share curriculum news and celebrations.
Question 6: Do you have any recommendations for enhancing school-to-parent communication?	One suggestion was the use of text messages to share updates. Unfortunately, it is incredibly expensive to send text messages as a school so this is not a viable option. We will only use text messaging in an emergency or very short notice situation. We will continue to refine our systems and please ask the office if clarification if needed.
Question 7: Do you feel the Senior Leadership Team (Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher) are approachable and friendly?	88% strongly agreed 12% agreed
Question 8: Do you feel that any concerns are taken seriously/acted upon by SLT?	76% strongly agreed 18% agreed 5% were neutral
Question 9: Do you feel that your child enjoys their time at school?	83% strongly agreed 15% agreed 1 person was neutral
Question 10: Do you feel that the school	90% strongly agreed 5% agreed 1 person was neutral and 1 person disagreed

We regularly ask children how they feel about school and their feedback is very positive. This year we introduced "Feelings Check-ins" into every classroom, giving the children further opportunity to share and discuss their feelings. Our PSHE curriculum, SCARF provides many opportunities for children to talk about their feelings and worries and we have 2 schools ELSA's, Mrs McEwan and Mrs Allen-Scholey on hand to support them. In September, every classroom will have its own "Worry box" for children to share their feelings/worries. In February, we celebrated "Mental Health week" with a variety of activities including daily mindfulness, dress down/cosy day and a sensory woodland walk.

Question 11: How would you rate the range of extracurricular activities offered?

As an infant school we have a comparatively extensive offer of extra-curricular activities. All of these clubs, with the exception of Arts and Crafts and Beginners football are run by external agencies. We do not charge these clubs to use our premises so there is no financial gain to us, the benefit is only to the children.

We agree that our clubs are heavily dance focused but there is a demand for this as these clubs are regularly full. We would be very keen to offer a wider variety if things were available. For example, we used to offer Karate but the club moved to a junior school where the demand was greater. Please let us know if you have any contacts to clubs who would like to run here.

Question 12: What additional extracurricular activities would you suggest?

Unfortunately, we can only offer what is available. We are delighted to say that we have already arranged for a "Marvellous maths" club to run in Autumn 2 and also intend to run a "multi-skills sports" club at that time. We have been liaising with a local Spanish teacher to offer Spanish lessons. Unfortunately, they do not have availability currently but this club will start as soon as they are available.
