In **Phonics**, we will begin phase 3 "Essential Letters and sounds" which is our whole school phonics scheme. The children will continue to learn the sound that goes with each letter, how the letters are formed and will practise blending short words.

In Literacy, we will be sharing non-fiction and fiction books about people who help us in our communities. The children will also learn about the emergency services and what they do to help us.

In **Reading**, we will continue to share books as a class and in small groups. We will be practising using the harder to read and spell words that we have learnt in phonics and we will also be practising sounding out and blending words to read sentences.

In Communication and language: This half term we will be practising following one step instructions and embedding listening skills in small groups and at carpet time. The children will also start to learn about positional language using words such as next to, inside, beside, infront, behind etc.

In SCARF (Safetly, Caring, Acheivement, Resilience, Friendship), we will be learning about differences and the importance of valuing difference in our community. We will be learning about how each of us is special and how we can be caring to the people around us.

In Mathematics. We will be looking in depth at numbers from 1-5. This means that we will be representing 1-5 with the correct numbers, we will be comparing numbers and quantities to 5 and also starting to understand that number 1-5 can be composed of smaller numbers. We will start to learn about 2D shapes and learning about positional language.

In Expressive Art and Design: We will be creating our very own fire work pictures with paint. We will also be using role play to help us learn about different jobs in our community and the emergency services.

Towards Christmas we will be creating our own Christmas decorations for use in school and at home.

In Knowledge and Understanding the World, the children will look in detail at the roles of people in our community who help us, from the emergency services to dentists, vets, crossing patrol and trades people. We will also learn about birthdays and how different people celebrate them.

How you can help your child at home:

- Read on a regular basis, either your child's school book or oxford owl website books.
- Help your child be independent in getting dressed and undressed.
- Talk to your child about different jobs in the community and the people who help us. You could talk about shop workers, crossing patrol, post office workers, dentists, doctors, police officers etc.

Please share home learning with us through Tapestry using photos and videos. We will be sharing our learning in school with you via tapestry too so keep your eyes peeled for our Year group and class posts.

Reading



Learning to read is one of the most important skills that your child will develop over the next few years. The more support and encouragement that you can offer your child, the more likely it is that he or she will make good progress.

At school we are using the *Essential Letters and Sounds teaching programme* to take your child through the early stages of learning to read, which is a step-by-step phonics reading scheme. It introduces the children to the letters and sounds (the alphabetic code) that are at the foundation of all reading and writing.

To reinforce the teaching in school, your child will bring home books to share with you that are closely matched to their phonic knowledge. Please aim to read with your child at least 3 times a week and sign in their reading diary.
